Yansiel Reinoso. Led the overall shooting category (4) in the match against British Virgin Islands on the last day of Group A.

Karel Pérez. Was present on the scoresheet in each of Cuba's matches in the championship (against Anguilla and British Virgin Islands).

David Perez. Celebrated a hat-trick, provided 1 assist, and is the player with the most shots in the Cuban team in the CONCACAF U-20 Championship Qualifiers 2024 (10).

Marcos Campos. Scored a hat-trick in the opening match against Anguilla. Totaled 5 shots in 2 appearances in the CONCACAF qualifying tournament.



Francis Castillo. Scored twice in both matches and positioned himself as one of the tournament's top scorers (4) alongside Bryan Destin from Haiti. Totaled 13 shots in the competition.

Andrés Martínez. Celebrated 3 goals in both Group stage matches and completed 10 shots in the current competition.

Joab Gutiérrez. Contributed 1 goal and 1 assist in the last match against Belize. Registers 2 goals in the CONCACAF tournament.

Huberts Ibarra. Did not concede any goals in his first 2 matches in Group A of the qualifying tournament with 6 saves and 2 clearances.

🕏 British Virgin Islands (VGB)

Azarni Callwood. Scored the only and first goal for the team in the defeat against Cuba in Matchday 2 of Group A and completed 2 shots in the game.

Harry Foden. Accumulates 10 saves and 15 clearances in the 2 appearances in goal for the British Virgin Islands in the qualifying tournament.

Johari Lacey. Is one of the players with the most shots in the national team in the current CONCACAF competition (2).

Qu YI Billingy. The 15-year-old defender made 1 shot on goal in the recent duel against Cuba. He is the second youngest player on his squad, behind Latriel Williams.



Carlos Palacios Jr. Made his debut in the CONCACAF U-20 Championship Qualifiers where he contributed 5 saves against Nicaragua.

Santiago Maquin. Is the player from Belize with the best shooting record in the qualifying tournament (4). He led the list of shots on target (3).



Clay Flores. Took 3 shots (1 on target and 2 off target) at the start of the CONCACAF competition against Nicaragua in Group A.

Devin Garbutt. The captain contributed 2 shots and 3 clearances in Belize's first match in the CONCACAF qualifying for the U-20.

El Salvador (SLV)

Wilber Díaz. Contributed his share of goals in El Salvador's 2 matches in the current competition. The 16-year-old forward scored 3 goals (2 from open play and 1 header) and took 5 shots.

Nelson Diaz. Is El Salvador's top assist provider in the CONCACAF U-20 Championship Qualifiers (3). He made 6 shots in the competition (1 goal).

Steven Guerra. Registered 2 assists and 4 shots in the current CONCACAF competition (1 shot on target and 3 off target).

Kiano Casamalhuapa. Was present on the scoresheet in the 2-2 draw against Guyana in Matchday 2 of the qualifying tournament.

Antigua and Barbuda (ATG)

Eroy Gonsalves. Took 2 shots and was the author of the first goal in the 3-2 defeat against Suriname on the last day of Group B.

Christopher Douglas. Contributed his share of goals against Guyana in the debut. The attacker leads the shooting category (5) in the qualifying tournament.

Tyrik Hughes. The midfielder made 2 shots in Antigua and Barbuda's last match in the tournament.

Taj Moore. Maintained a clean sheet thanks to 7 saves in the first match. Made 15 clearances and 9 saves in the current competition.



Nathaniel Pydana. Was the scorer of both goals for his team in the current competition. He scored from a penalty and from open play in the 2-2 draw against El Salvador.

Solomon Austin. The captain provided 1 assist, made 1 shot, and completed 2 clearances in the Matchday 2 fixture of the qualifying tournament.

Emmanuel Lewis. The 16-year-old goalkeeper made 7 saves and 5 clearances in his 2 appearances in the CONCACAF U-20 Championship Qualifiers.

Tyrel Stephen. Made 6 out of the 18 clearances against El Salvador in the last day of the qualifying tournament and completed 1 shot.





Robinio Pinas. The captain scored Suriname's first goal in their opening match in Group B of the CONCACAF U-20 Championship Qualifiers (vs. Antigua and Barbuda).

Djaier Prijor. Contributed 1 goal in the opening match of the qualifying tournament and was key in defense with 4 out of the 9 clearances for the team against Antigua and Barbuda.

Jahnilo Wiegel. Made his debut in the CONCACAF tournament and had a notable role with 2 saves and 1 clearance.

Marley Dors. Took 1 shot on target against Antigua and Barbuda and executed 8 out of the 9 corner kicks in Suriname's debut in the tournament.



Tarino Marchena. The 17-year-old youth scored the equalizing goal against Aruba in the last match of Group C and had 2 shots.

Jillian Bernardina. The full-back had direct involvement in Curacao's last goal. He totaled 2 shots in the current competition.

Leandro Merencia. Accumulates 3 saves and 3 clearances in the current edition of the qualifying tournament. Maintained a clean sheet in the opening match against Saint Martin.

Daminthly Bernardina. Celebrated the only goal against Saint Martin in Curacao's debut in the CONCACAF U-20 Championship Qualifiers.

OSaint Martin (SNM)

Roman Magloire. The 16-year-old goalkeeper totaled 11 saves and 17 clearances in the CONCACAF U-20 Championship Qualifiers.

Sacha Barakat. Made 1 shot in Saint Martin's first match in Group C of the U-20 Qualifiers for the CONCACAF Championship.

Mathieu Carty. Leads the category of shots (2) for Saint Martin in the qualifying tournament.

Andre Richardson. Wore the captain's armband in both matches for Saint Martin in the 2024 CONCACAF Championship Qualifiers.

Guatemala (GUA)

Matthew Evans. Scored a hat-trick from 4 shots in the 6-0 victory against Saint Martin in Round 2 of Group C.

Selvin Sagastume. Contributed to the goal in both of Guatemala's matches in the current tournament (1 goal and 1 assist). The 16-year-old midfielder completed 5 shots in both wins.



Diego Bolaños. Maintained a clean sheet in the last match against Saint Martin. He has 3 saves and 1 clearance in 2 appearances.

Daniel Mendez. Contributed his share of goals against Saint Martin where he was involved in 3 shots.



Connor Van Kilsdonk. Scored the only goal for his team in the debut match of Group B against Curacao and made 3 out of 5 shots in the debut game.

Jahmani Eisden. The goalkeeper and captain of Aruba contributed 2 saves and made 1 clearance in the opening match of the qualifying tournament.

Jayden Kruydenhof. Had a direct influence on Aruba's first goal in the current competition (1 assist).

Reangelo Boekhoudt. Came on as a substitute in the second half against Curacao and made 1 out of 5 shots in the team's debut in the tournament.

(*)Canada (CAN)

Tavio Ciccarelli. Canada thrashed Saint Vincent and the Grenadines 4-0 in the last match, with 3 out of the 4 goals scored by the 17-year-old forward (100% shooting accuracy).

Alessandro Biello. The captain contributed his share of goals and was one of Canada's players with the best shooting record in the last match (3). He has a total of 4 shots in the tournament.

Myles Morgan. Scored a hat-trick in the 8-0 victory against Dominica at the start of the CONCACAF qualifying tournament. Contributed 6 shots in the first match.

Matteo Schiavoni. Made 2 shots on target and provided 1 assist in the match against Saint Vincent and the Grenadines.



Adriel Lawrence. Was the player who made the most shots in the last match against Trinidad and Tobago (4).

Lyan Edwards. Totaled 5 clearances in the 2 matches of the current competition.

Keeyan Thomas. The captain contributed 2 shots in the last game.

Jaylan Jno Ville. The 17-year-old defender made 4 out of Dominica's 10 clearances in the 5-0 defeat against Trinidad and Tobago.

Trinidad (TRI)

Larry Noel. Contributed his goal tally in the 2 victories against Saint Vincent and the Grenadines (3-2) and Dominica (5-0) and was the player with the most shots (14).



Michael Chaves. Scored from open play in each of the Group D matchdays and completed 7 shots in the tournament.

Ailan Panton. The 17-year-old goalkeeper kept a clean sheet in the 5-0 victory against Dominica thanks to his 3 saves. Played in goal for Trinidad and Tobago in both matches.

Rio Cardines. Registered 3 shots in the last match for the team against Dominica, where he celebrated a goal from open play in the first half.



Tristan John. Made 6 saves and 1 clearance in the last match against Canada. Has a total of 14 saves and 2 clearances in the qualifying tournament.

Kirtney Franklyn. The captain has 2 shots in the tournament and was the scorer of a penalty goal in the team's first match in the defeat against Trinidad and Tobago in Matchday 1.

Steven Pierre. Was one of the goal scorers for Saint Vincent in the debut of the Qualifiers for the 2024 Sub-20 Championship. Has 2 shots in the current competition.

Frankroy Cain. Provided an assist to Steven Pierre's header in the first half of the match against Trinidad in Matchday 1.

Bryan Destin. Scored 4 goals and totaled 10 shots in Group E (against Cayman Islands and St. Kitts and Nevis). Celebrated a hat-trick (from open play, header, and penalty) in the opening match.

Jaylen-Andre Vilsaint. The captain scored 1 goal and made 3 clearances against St. Kitts and Nevis in Round 2.

Louis Isaie. The forward has 4 shots and 1 goal in the current competition.

Schneilorens Lebrun. Scored the first goal for Haiti with a header in the opening match of Group E in the CONCACAF qualifying tournament.



Benjamin Donato. Scored the equalizing goal against the Cayman Islands and was the top shooter in the last match for Puerto Rico (3).

Daniel Cruz. Led the shooting category for the Puerto Rican team (8). Celebrated 1 of the 6 goals in the CONCACAF qualifying tournament (against St. Kitts and Nevis).

Juan Torres. The 17-year-old midfielder had an impact on Puerto Rico's last goal with 1 assist in the 1-1 draw against the Cayman Islands.

Sebastián Otero. Made 6 shots in the matches against St. Kitts and Nevis and the Cayman Islands and scored 1 goal in the qualifying tournament.





Lachlin Lambert. The 17-year-old goal keeper made 7 saves and added 2 clearances in the first 2 matches against the teams of Haiti and Puerto Rico.

Justin Byles. Was responsible for the opening goal in the 1-1 draw against Puerto Rico in the last match of the qualifying round.

Kane Watson. Leads the ranking of clearances (15) in the Cayman Islands team in the qualifying tournament for the CONCACAF U20 Championship 2024.

Immanuel Duran. Accumulates 2 shots and 1 assist in his 2 appearances in the current CONCACAF competition.

St. Kitts and Nevis (SKN)

Kai Francois. Leads the overall list of saves (19) in the qualifiers. Made 4 clearances against Puerto Rico and 6 against Haiti.

Shervin King. Was one of the players from the St. Kitts and Nevis team who had his chance to score against Haiti in the last match (1 shot).

Devion Harvey. Was the player with the most clearances against Puerto Rico (5) in Round 1.

De Quan Hamilton. The 16-year-old forward made 2 shots and took 2 corner kicks in the team's 2 matches in the tournament.
