All-Time series PAN vs MEX

Mexico has gone 14 consecutive games without losing against Panama (12W-2D). The last defeat was on July 24, 2013, in that year's Concacaf Gold Cup, 1-2, with goals from Blas Pérez 12' and Román Torres 60', and Luis Montes 25' scored for Mexico.

Regarding the Nations League, they will face each other for the 4th time, all previous matches ended in victory for the Mexican national team, 3-1 (Roberto Alvarado 28', José Juan Macías 75', and Rodolfo Pizarro 90+2' for Mexico, an own goal by Carlos Salcedo 42' in favor of Panama) and 0-3 in 2019-2020 (Raúl Jiménez 8', penalty 85', Édson Alvarez 70') and 0-1 (Jesús Gallardo 4') in 2022-2023. It will be the 2nd time they face each other in a game where position or qualification is at stake since in 2022-2023, they faced each other in the match for 3rd place with a 1-0 victory for Mexico, with a goal by Jesús Gallardo 4'.

Players to watch:

José Fajardo. Scored a goal in both of Panama's victories in the quarter-finals against Costa Rica. He is the team's top scorer in the CNL 2023-24 with (3) and the player with the most shots with (7).

Adalberto Carrasquilla. Scored 1 goal and provided 1 assist in his 4 appearances in League A. Winner of the Golden Ball Award in the 2023 Gold Cup, he provided assists in both quarter-final matches against Costa Rica. Carrasquilla has three assists.

Orlando Mosquera. Thanks to his 5 saves in the quarter-finals against Costa Rica, Panama managed to advance. He participated in 2 out of the 4 matches in League A 2023/24 and kept a clean sheet in the 3-0 victory against Guatemala in the final of Group A.



Mexico was the runner-up in the inaugural edition of the CNL 019/20 after losing the final 3-2 in extra time against the United States, with goals from Gio Reyna, Weston McKennie, and

Christian Pulisic; Jesús Corona and Diego Laínez scored for Mexico, at Empower Field at Mile High in Denver (June 6, 2021).

They finished in 3rd place in the 2022/23 edition when they defeated Panama.

Players to watch:

Edson Álvarez. Scored 1 of Mexico's 2 goals against Honduras in the quarter-finals (Luis Chávez also scored from a free-kick). The midfielder was the leading player in passes (165) in the series against Honduras.

Hirving Lozano. Was the Mexican with the most shots (8) in the quarter-finals. He has scored two goals in the CNL in 2019/20 against Bermuda and 2022/23 against Jamaica.

Santiago Giménez. Provided an assist in the 2-0 victory against Honduras in the quarter-finals of the CNL 2023/24. Scored the goal that gave Mexico the title in the 2023 Gold Cup final against Panama (1-0).
